



## **Guided Household Worship**

### **For Individuals**

*Sunday Morning, March 22, 2020, 10:30 A.M.*

*Open Resurrection OPC's Facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/resurrectionopc/>) sometime before 10:30. Make sure the Internet is working and your speakers are on. Open [the first audio file \("Holy, Holy, Holy!"\)](#) so you can be ready to sing, then try to set the computer aside or cover the screen if possible to reduce distractions.*

### **Meditation**

*Begin by reading Philippians 2:3-8. Even if you are worshiping alone, consider reading it aloud.*

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

### **God's Call to Worship**

*Read Psalm 113:1-3, where God calls His servants to praise His name because He is worthy of our worship.*

Praise the Lord! Praise, O servants of the Lord, praise the name of the Lord! Blessed be the name of the Lord from this time forth and forevermore! From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the Lord is to be praised!

### **Hymn: "Holy, Holy, Holy!"**

*Find your PDF or printout of the music and words for "Holy, Holy, Holy!" Then, play the audio file and sing all four stanzas. It is okay to stand or sit.*

*"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" (Isaiah 6:3)*

*Immediately after the hymn concludes, pray a prayer of praise, ending with the Lord's Prayer (see the top of the next page).*

## Prayer of Praise

*Praise God for who He is and what He has done, and ask for His blessing on this set-aside time of private worship.<sup>1</sup> Then pray the Lord's Prayer. Consider praying out loud:*

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

## Confession of Faith

*Recite the Apostles' Creed as a summary of what the Bible teaches about who God is and what He has done for us in the life, death, resurrection, and reign of Christ.*

I believe in God the Father Almighty,  
Maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead.  
He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the  
Father Almighty.  
From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church,  
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen!

## The Law of God

*Immediately after the Apostle's Creed, spend some time meditating on the third commandment using these questions and answers:*

### ***What is the third commandment?***

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain, for the Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain. *[from Exodus 20:7]*

### ***What is God's will for us in the third commandment?***

That we neither blaspheme nor misuse the name of God by cursing, perjury, or unnecessary oaths, nor share in such horrible sins by being silent bystanders. In a word, it requires that we use the holy name of God only with reverence and awe, so that we may properly confess him, pray to him, and praise him in everything we do and say. *[from Heidelberg Catechism #99]*

## Confessing Our Sins

*Confess your sins to God. Be specific. Always remember to ask for God's forgiveness through the death of Jesus and thank Him for the promises of the Gospel.*

## Believing God's Promise of Forgiveness

*Read aloud 1 John 2:1-2:*

"My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world."

*In response, you might sing the Gloria Patri (without accompaniment).*

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen, Amen.

## Psalm: 46A

*Find your PDF or printout of the music and words for Psalm 46A. Then, play the audio file and sing all five stanzas. It is okay to stand or sit.*

*When you finish singing Psalm 46, it will probably be close to 11:00 and time for the sermon. If you don't get to the Psalm or finish all the stanzas before 11:00, sing it afterwards.*
